On Tuesday, April 7th, at approximately 9:00 am, Hinsdale police officers responded to the Dunkin Donuts, 150 E. Ogden Avenue, to investigate a delayed robbery that had occurred at approximately 3:05 am earlier that morning. The suspect was reported to have displayed an unknown pistol after entering the business through an unlocked rear door and having an employee remove approximately \$200.00 from a cash register. The suspect, who was described as a male/black with a mustache, wearing a black quilted jacket, with a black hooded sweatshirt, skull-cap, and dark colored pants, fled the scene through the same rear door on foot. There were no reported injuries and security cameras provided investigators with video evidence of the incident.

On Wednesday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:00 am, Hinsdale police officers returned to the same Dunkin Donuts location after a the clerk reported a suspicious incident that involved a subject matching the description of the offender from the robbery. The suspect entered the front door of the business and proceeded to place a stack of money on the counter with a hand-written note apologizing for taking the money the morning before. The suspect exited the store, left the scene on a bike, and was last seen heading south on York Road.

At approximately 5:30 pm on April 8<sup>th</sup>, Hinsdale police officers observed a subject matching the description of the suspect riding a bike westbound on Symonds Drive from Elm Street. Officers stopped the individual in the area of Symonds and Park and identified him as the offender in the case. He was taken in to custody without incident and transported to the Hinsdale Police Department where he confessed to the robbery.

The offender, identified as Alex M. Holmes, 17 years old, from 538 Mills Street, Hinsdale, was charged with one count of aggravated robbery and transported to DuPage County Jail.
