Chairman Keseric called the meeting of the Historic Preservation Commission to order at 5:00 p.m. on March 10, 2009 in Memorial Hall in the Memorial Building, 19 East Chicago Avenue, Hinsdale IL.

### **Minutes**

### **Discussion**

#### **National Preservation Month**

Chairman Keseric introduced the topic and provided an update to the Commissioners. Mr. Gascoigne also provided information to the Commissioners regarding judging for the awards and sponsorships. He also gave a brief timeline of when deadlines for the Preservation Awards will be. Discussion between the Commissioners took place over responsibilities that remained for preservation month and other items related to preservation month.

#### **Graue Mill Dam**

Chairman Keseric provided background information to the Commissioners and questioned Mr. Gascoigne if any new updates were available. Mr. Gascoigne stated two public meetings were in the process of scheduling

Carol Smith, past president of Graue mill, stated this was an item for discussion about 6 years ago. She provided the Commissioners with information on the history of Graue Mill and the museum. She stated the proposed removal of the dam could provide better

**water quality and aeration to the river. She stressed the need for a medium between the environment and the culture and historical characteristics of communities. The Commission discussed the historical benefits of the dam and the detail of the upcoming public meetings and ideas on how they could contribute to help save the dam.**
